With so many many new, great families joining us in Westchester, we wanted to begin an initiative called "Meet Your Neighbor!". We plan to highlight one of our neighborhood families each RAP issue, to help each other get to know one another. We're looking forward to meeting everyone and helping our neighbors grow closer to one another.

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Bloom Where You are Planted

These tips are drawn from *Lone Star Gardening* by Neil Sperry and The River Oaks Garden Club's *A Garden Book for Houston and the Texas Gulf Coast, 5th edition*. (The latter book advocates organic gardening practices but has a wealth of information specific to our area that is useful to all.)

If desired, groundcover beds of Asian jasmine, mondo grass, and liriope can be trimmed with a line trimmer or mower early in the month. (It needs to be done before the mondo grass and liriope send up their new shoots for the spring to avoid "squaring off" the tips of the new shoots.)

If you need to reduce a shrub's size, this is the best month to do that. Nandina's can be pruned by cutting some of the tallest canes to the ground leaving some shorter stems to help the plant as it fills out.

Crape Myrtles can be pruned by removing unwanted trunks and branches but do not "top" them since it will delay their first blooms and does not increase blooms later in the season. Repeat blooming roses can be pruned and fertilized sometime around Valentine's Day. (Once blooming climbers, etc. shouldn't be pruned until after they bloom in the spring.)

This is the most favorable month to try to root cuttings of hardwood shrubs, trees, and vines. This is a great month to begin making plans for any changes you hope to make in your yard this year.

It was the perfect size and had all the A/V equipment we needed.

We need hosts for monthly get-togethers

One of the things that the Women's Club commits to is a gathering once per month. At these gatherings, we have a short business meeting, where if we need to vote on something, we can do that.

We have a host for March's meeting, so mark your calendar for 10 a.m. on Thursday, March 23, at Lilac Gallery's home.

However, we need a host for February's and April's meetings. The host can choose a morning event or an evening event. The Women's Club can provide paper products, and we have a percolator for coffee. These are usually a bring-something-to-share event, so all the host needs to provide is a place to meet and a table for snacks.

Annual grant applications are open

One of the group's main activities is to provide annual grants to nonprofit groups. These grants are usually in amounts from \$100 to \$500, and preference is given to groups with the following qualities:

- The group applying for the grant has some association to a member of the Women's Club.
- The group is local to our area (not a national organization).
- Grants that have a specific purpose rather than for the general fund.
- Groups that have a history with the Women's Club.
- Many groups that have received grants work with children in the area.

Groups that would like to apply for a grant can do so <u>on</u> <u>this form</u>. The form includes a few questions about the group and then provides a way for the group to upload a grant application letter in either document or PDF format.

The application form will close at 11:59 p.m. on Friday, April 14.

We are in the process of putting together the grant application committee. After the application deadline, the committee will meet before May 1 to put together a proposed list of grant recipients. That list will be up for approval in mid May by the Women's Club members, and checks will be sent around the first of June.

We are working on building interest groups

One way the Women's Club fosters connection is through interest groups. These groups are started and maintained by members of the group, and they can start and end as there is interest. At the Jan. 12 meeting, several types of interest groups were mentioned, including:
