Hi Neighbors!

If you're interested in getting involved with the HOA and making a difference in our community, here's a big opportunity! Many of your WOC board members will not be returning in 2023. The Election will be held at the annual meeting on January 17

As you know the voting for the two Special Assessments has been extended to the Annual Meeting on January 17. These Special Assessments are needed to ensure adequate funding for our neighborhood for the upcoming few years. Be sure to VOTE. Not voting does not help your Board determine the necessary steps to either properly maintain or dispose of our common properties. If you have any questions, feel free to ask a Board member.

A reminder on what we are asking, and how the votes initially turned out:

Special Assessment 1

This one-time assessment of \$375, to be collected in January, covers work needed pool work, such as replastering

- Approve 102 (77%)
- Disapprove 33 (23%)

Special Assessment 2

This assessment of \$300, to be collected in 3rd quarter of 2023, covers future planned Club facility maintenance and repairs, such as fence replacement, electrical work, window replacement, painting and other much needed items.

- Approve 77 (57%)
- Disapprove 57 (43%)

For a resolution of each special assessment, a minimum vote total of 184 of members (just over 50%) must vote to either Approve or Disapprove each special assessment.

Bloom Where You are Planted

Yard of the Month and Gardening Tips

In the event of a freeze, the "mushy"/dark vegetation on annuals such as impatiens, begonias, angelonia, pentas, and ginger, etc. can be removed immediately after the freeze. For plants with bark such as lantana, hibiscus, bottlebrush, esperanza, duranta, plumbago, oleander, and hamelia, etc., it is safer to wait to remove the dead looking parts until the danger of another freeze has passed. If you scratch its surface and see green tissue then the plant is still alive. After the danger of a freeze is passed, they can be pruned back to live wood. If there's nothing green above the soil, remove the dead top. Some plants will come back from the roots. Likewise, don't prune palms immediately after a freeze but the crown can be sprayed with a copper-based fungicide and repeated in 10 days.

Pansies, violas, snapdragons, dianthus, and ornamental cabbage and kale can be planted now.

Annuals can be fed with water-soluble high nitrogen plant food during warm spells.

This is a great time for planting new shrubs and trees except for those that might be freeze tender.
