

Letter from the Board

We've continued to have discussions with stakeholders in the neighborhood regarding the pool and our plan moving forward.

As a result of these discussions, we have shifted our primary focus and priority on the big-ticket pool maintenance items such as re-plastering the pool, replacing the tiles and other key projects that are important for the swim team to have an adequate facility next season and beyond. We are currently soliciting bids for this work.

Apart from that, we also have been continuing to work on a plan for the clubhouse and pavilion remodel to present to the neighborhood. We really hope to have robust turnout at our next HOA meeting on Tuesday, September 20 at 6:00 at St. John Vianney in Room C-11 (this is a change from our normal meeting space) to discuss the plan as it currently is and what we hope to accomplish moving forward to finalize it for a vote.

Aside from the pool project, we have also been in discussions with our neighbors in Ashford Forest and

Nottingham Forest to get a feel for what it might take to build a brick wall along Dairy Ashford, which has been a strong ask from many of our neighbors for years.

The board has also been working together to put together the 2023 WOC budget.

Dave and Ryan have renegotiated our trash and recycling services contract with Texas Pride and have successfully kept a price increase to a minimum. Feel free to attend the meeting or email Dave if you have more questions on that front.

We have also ensured there is budget for flowers and landscaping at our entrances in 2023.

Last but not least, fall will be a busy season with lots of fun social activities planned to get out and socialize with each other. We are still on the hunt for National Night Out hosts, and for another Westchester host home for the return of the Holiday Home Tour. Reach out to Natalie with interest in hosting either event.

Bloom Where You are Planted

Yard of the Month and Gardening Tips

For cool season color plant ageratum, alyssum, chrysanthemum, verbena, and petunias. Wait until later in the month to plant pinks, snapdragons, and ornamental cabbage and kale. (Wait until October to plant pansies since they become lanky if planted when the weather is too warm).

Apply a final application of fertilizer for the year to your lawn in late September or early October. If you notice circular patches in your St. Augustine grass that are 12 to 24 inches across where the grass first turns yellow then brown, apply a labeled fungicide for brown patch which can become an issue in the cooler, wetter climate of the fall here.

Divide and transplant dormant irises, daylilies, and cala lilies if they are crowded.

Along with other plants keep azaleas and camellias watered if it doesn't rain.


If desired apply a pre-emergent herbicide very early in the month to stop the germination of annual grassy and broadleaf weeds. The timing is critical for them to be effective. If you can see the weeds or they have already germinated it's too late to control them in this way for this year.
